Glossary of Terms



Here are some of the key words, terms and phrases used within our education sessions and resources. We have also included some useful web references that can be used in wider research around the topics.

Black Bin

The bin used by households in Test Valley for rubbish that cannot be recycled.

Brown Bin

The bin used by households in Test Valley for recyclable items. The following items can be put in a brown bin for recycling:

- ★ Paper
- **★** Cardboard
- ★ Plastic bottles
- ★ Tins and cans
- ★ Aerosols

Household Waste

The term used to describe the waste you would put in your black bin. This waste would not include any items than can be recycled.

Household Waste Recycling Centre - HWRC

Household Waste Recycling Centre's (HWRC) are provided and operated by Hampshire County Council. They are provided for the public to dispose of domestic waste, garden waste, recyclable materials, oil and limited amounts of rubble.

Incinerator

A method of treating waste by heating it at high temperatures to produce ash, heat and gas.

Local Recycling Centre - LRC

Local Recycling Centres collect a variety of materials that cannot be recycled in your brown bin but can be recycled in some way. There are over 100 LRCs across the borough collecting the following materials:

- ★ Glass bottles and jars
- **★** Aluminium foil
- **★** Books
- ★ Clothes and shoes
- **★** Cartons

Materials Recovery Facility - MRF

Materials Recovery Facilities handle the materials put in your brown bin. They sort and separate recyclable materials into different types before sending them for reprocessing into new products.

Resource

A stock or supply of a material that can be used to create a product.



Recycle

Recycling converts used materials into new products that can be used again.

Items that have not reached the end of their useful life can be passed on to others when you have finished them.

Rubbish - see 'Waste'

Trade Waste

Waste generated by a business as a result of their commercial operation. This waste is not collected through the household waste collection system. Businesses must pay for this waste to be collected and disposed of.

Waste

Items that are no longer required, not of use any more or are broken or damaged.

Waste Disposal

Removing used or unwanted items before destroying or storing it in some way.

Waste Management

The activity of dealing with waste.

This includes dealing with waste before it is produced (see 'Reduce') and afterwards (see reuse and recycle).
