Infrastructure and Developer Contributions Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) 2022

Test Valley Borough Council has published for public participation its draft Infrastructure and Developer Contributions Supplementary Planning Document (SPD) 2022 and is inviting representations between Friday 4th November and Friday 16th December.

The purpose of the SPD is to; explain the Council's approach to using planning obligations to local residents, developers and the wider community; explain the circumstances under which the Council will collect Section 106 contributions to mitigate the impacts of a development on infrastructure; set out the standard required for some types of infrastructure and provide applicants with greater certainty on when planning obligations will be sought.

The document provides detailed guidance on the application of the Adopted Local Plan (2016) policies in respect of developer contributions secured through planning applications. It helps to guide the Council's approach to securing and delivering infrastructure requirements associated with new development setting out the Council's expectations regarding the approach to negotiation.
