# LICENSING ACT 2003 How to apply for a Personal Licence



You must apply to the Council for the area in which you are ordinarily resident i.e. if you do not live in Test Valley Borough then you must NOT apply to Test Valley Borough Council for a Personal Licence. Please note that once issued, your licence will last indefinitely and can be used in any local authority area within England and Wales.

You can only apply for a Personal Licence if you are aged 18 or over, have not had a Personal Licence forfeited within the last five years, possess an accredited licensing qualification (see below) and have not been convicted of any relevant or foreign offence. You must also have the right to work in the UK.

# Before applying for a Personal Licence you will need to be in possession of the following:

An accredited licensing qualification – the Level 2 Award for Personal Licence Holders. The Home Secretary has accredited the following personal licence qualifications under the Licensing Act 2003, commencing on 1 December 2017:

Once you are in possession of both of the above you are ready to submit your application which should comprise the following:

- 2) The application form completed in black ink or type
- 3) The criminal convictions and declarations form completed in black ink or type
- 4) Your licensing qualification or proof that you hold such a qualification
- 5) Your criminal records check
- 6) The fee of £37 (please make cheques payable to Test Valley Borough Council; we can accept debit but not credit card payments)
- 7) Two photographs, one of which is endorsed as a true likeness of you by a solicitor or a notary, a person of standing in the community (including a bank or building society official, a police officer, a civil servant or a minister of religion) or any individual with a professional qualification (NB the photographs must be taken against a light background so that the applicant's features are distinguishable and contrast against the background, be 45mm by 35 mm, show the full face uncovered and without sunglasses and, unless the applicant wears a head covering due to his religious beliefs, without a head covering and be printed on photographic paper)
- 8) Copies of documentation proving your right to work in the UK as required by the Immigration Act 2016. Details of suitable documentation appear on the application form.

Once completed, all of the above items should be sent to

Licensing Section, Legal and Democratic Service, Test Valley Borough Council, Beech Hurst, Weyhill Road, Andover, Hampshire SP10 3AJ.

We may liaise with Hampshire Police or Home Office Immigration Enforcement concerning your application. In certain circumstances they may object to the granting of a licence. If this happens we will contact you. If no objection is made we will process your application and aim to issue your licence within a month of the application being received.
