Dear Sirs.

I wish to object to the Test Valley Borough Draft Local Plan 2040, specifically the consideration of Velmore Farm, Valley Park. As a resident in the local area I am acutely aware of the following issues already present in the area:

- 1. Road congestion in this specific area is already increasing creating long delays and more environmental pollution than is necessary. Any increase in traffic can only exacerbate this.
- 2. The local infrastructure is already under strain with a lack of gp appointments, no NHS dentist availability, school class numbers beyond an acceptable level.
- 3. The environmental impact of further housing both in terms of air pollution let alone potential drainage issues and potential flooding which is already an issue at the proposed main access point. There will also inevitably be an increase in noise pollution.
- 4. Once again Green Space, frequented by a host of wildlife such as deer, fox and nesting birds will be destroyed.
