Good news from APCA

Dear Resident

Great news! APCA (Augusta Park Community Association) has been awarded funding from the MoD to support three community projects. These projects are based on feedback that you have given to us over the last couple of years about your wants and needs, and have been developed to provide an opportunity to improve the integration of families within the community living on the development. These projects are part of the larger APCA initiative to provide a community centre and associated activities for the development.

The projects are:

Green Spaces Project (£5,000)

This will support all environmental projects which are focussed on improving outdoor/green spaces on the development. The project includes the provision of equipment for the creation of a community allotment and Armed Forces memorial garden.

Soft-Play Project (£8,000)

This will provide a soft-play area (and associated health and safety procedures) for use by APCA groups, at APCA events and for private hire.

Pack-Away Sensory Room project (£6,500)

This will make equipment available for use by APCA groups, particularly local groups that support children/adults with additional needs.

These projects are focused on supporting the needs of APCA Families, and providing opportunities for them to engage and become part of the community. As such, we would like to set up three groups to take ownership of these projects and make them happen. Of course all of the groups will be supported by the Trustees.

What are we looking for?

Each group will have a Trustee on board to make sure that we meet the requirements of the grant award, keep track of spending and to provide support throughout. Each group will also need a *team of volunteers* to come up with ideas and to help out with getting these projects up and running. We would also like volunteers for two specific roles:

Chair: To organise and chair group meetings and to keep track of the list of actions that the group needs to do.

Note taker: To write down all of the actions and key decisions at each meeting and to keep a list of group members.

Development update

Following a resident consultation on 4 November 2014, a planning application for a ten bed care home on the Northern Local Centre Site, East Anton Farm Road (currently where the temporary community centre is situated) has been submitted to Test Valley Borough Council. You can view the planning application on Test Valley Borough Council's website by using the "View Planning Applications" link on the homepage and searching for the reference number 15/00104/FULLN.

A planning application for 350 dwellings with access, parking, open space and landscaping including allotments on the surplus secondary school site was taken to the Northern Area Planning Committee in February where councillors resolved to grant planning permission, subject to the developer entering into a legal agreement to deliver a number of benefits to the local area. The benefits include improvements to the local highway infrastructure and leisure facilities. The planning application for the northern local centre (the area in between the temporary community centre and the new community centre) was refused in 2014. The developers, Daytona East Anton Ltd, have appealed against this

refusal. In tandem with this appeal the developers ran a resident consultation in January 2015 regarding a possible future application and have subsequently submitted a new planning application for this site. The play park behind the community centre is now open for use and has been very popular.

As you may have seen, the traffic management measures which were outlined and consulted upon in 2014 have now been implemented at East Anton. There are yellow lines on the roads near the school and the surrounding area. These measures should help ease the movement of vehicles and pedestrians along these well used roads. Regular patrols by the council's enforcement officers will be undertaken. Would you like to be part of Neighbourhood Watch?

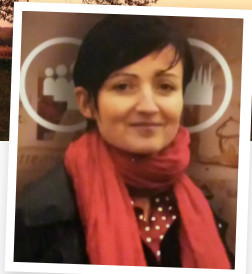

Andover becomes a Dementia Friendly High Street

Following Hampshire County Council's Dementia Friendly Hampshire: The Story So Far pop-up exhibition at the beginning of February, Andover was formally recognised as having a Dementia Friendly High Street on Friday, 27 February. This occasion also marked the end of the Dementia Friendly Communities project run by Andover Mind.

Andover Mind has been working with Test Valley Borough Council, Andover Town Council and other local organisations to encourage them to commit to ensuring the service they offer is dementia friendly. This involves training staff to be aware of the condition and putting simple measures in place to ensure their services are accessible and inclusive.

Kristina is able to provide 'Dementia Friends Information Sessions' at Augusta Park. These are hour long interactive sessions, aiming to increase the understanding of Dementia and allow you to become a Dementia Friend. Dementia Friends is a social action movement, organised by the Alzheimer's Society aiming to turn this understanding into action. It has recently been in the news that one million people have now become Dementia Friends. Travel plan



Bus route

There has been a change in bus operators and route at Augusta Park. Augusta Park is now being serviced by Wheelers Bus Company with a new route entering Augusta Park along Smannell Road. You can hail the bus by simply popping your hand out on the Smannell Road roundabout leading up to Endeavour School. There is a route plan and timetable on the lamp post where you are picked up and dropped off. There are buses into town and occasional buses to Tesco and the hospital. As the development continues to grow and the roads are completed, there will be more bus stops within Augusta Park. You can find a timetable of bus times on the Wheelers website. There are also paper copies at the community centre.

Buss Pass Scheme

As Augusta Park is now being serviced by the Wheelers Bus Company, the Stagecoach bus pass scheme for residents is no longer available. A Wheelers bus pass scheme will soon be available. Anyone who hasn't had their full quota of Stagecoach passes or is the first occupant of the house and has not applied for a pass will be able to apply for a Wheelers pass instead.

The road between The Chariots and the Community Centre and Endeavour School is not open to general use. It is currently a developer's only route and the road outside of the school will be

a bus only route, with a rising bollard. Cars are not and will be permitted to use this route.



Cycle vouchers

P Parking

Please, please, please use your allocated parking spaces to park your vehicles! There have been reports of cars parked close to junctions and roundabouts, which causes restricted vision. Cars parked on pavements and roadsides make it difficult for pedestrians to move around safely. This can be especially dangerous for children. Wheelchair users and residents with buggies have often been forced to walk on the road which is unsafe. Bin collection has also not been possible on certain roads due to bad parking. Emergency Services such as fire engines would also find it difficult to access some roads and houses where residents have parked inconsiderately. Vehicles parked on pavements which are causing an obstruction should be reported to the police using the **101** number.

Health Walks

Health Walks continue to run every two weeks on Thursday mornings at 10.30am leaving from the temporary community centre. The walks take approximately one hour and are accompanied by a trained Health Walk leader. There is no charge to attend the walks.
