Dear Mr Smith,

Re: Mapping in Broughton

Further to today's conversation with Mrs Karen Eastly, I would like to bring the following to your attention:

The TVBC map of Broughton shows my garden as "countryside" although it is (and has been for hundreds of years) part of the Blackbirds residential plot. The house now known as Aylesbury House was sold in 1989, so that the present-day Blackbirds plot is L-shaped and the layout is as shown in the enclosed extract from the deeds and the accompanying letter from Paris, Smith and Randall who hold the Blackbirds deeds. For clarity, I also enclose my own outline map, derived from the O.S. map.

I have been in contact with Ordnance Survey who, at some point, had omitted the North Western boundary because the fence was obscured by trees in their aerial photograph. This seems to have resulted in my garden being shown as part of the field next to that boundary. They have now reviewed the site and corrected their mapping. I enclose a copy of their 20<sup>th</sup> July letter.

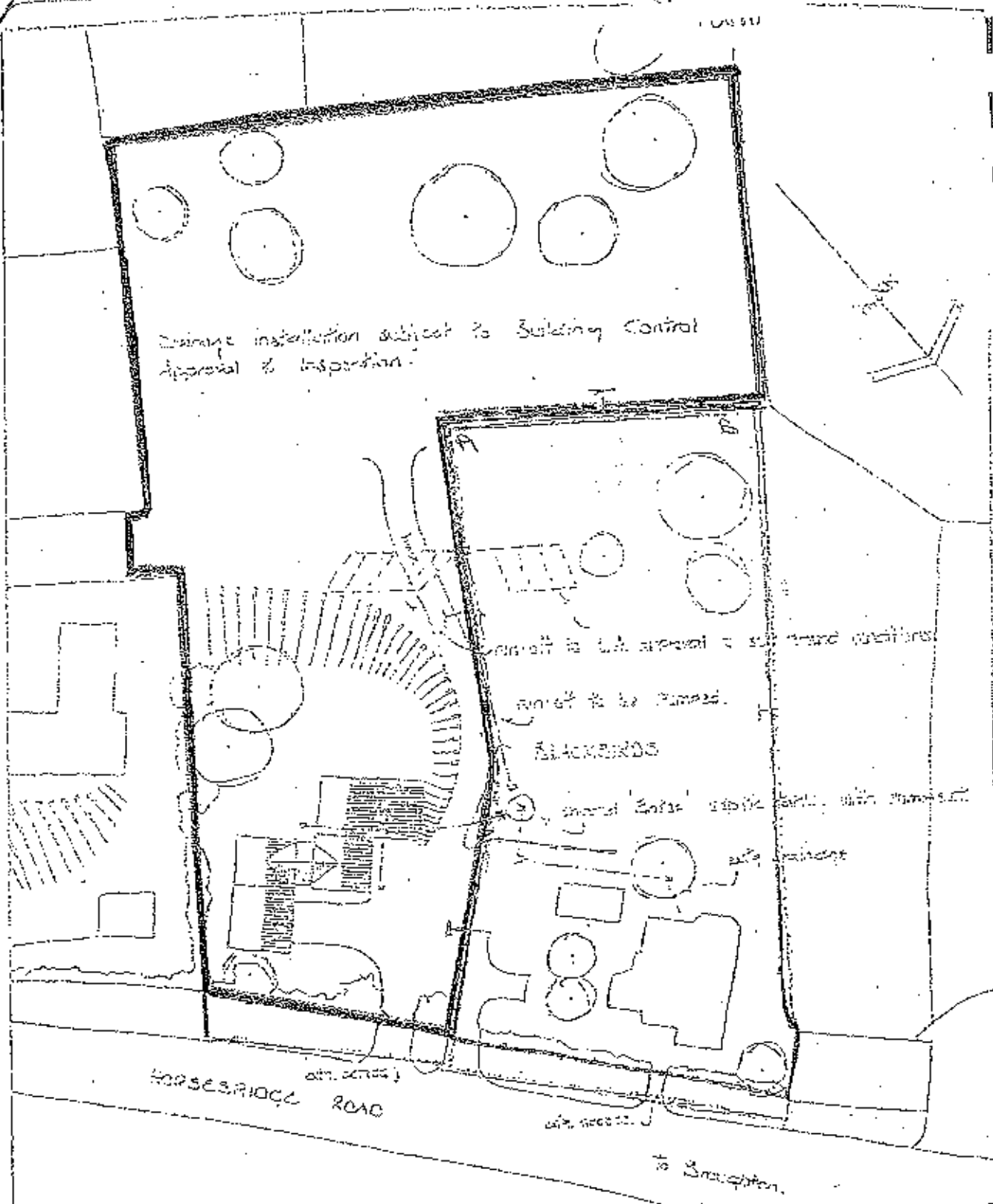
This corrected mapping will filter through to you in a couple of week's time. Please will you reinstate my garden rather than showing it as countryside.
